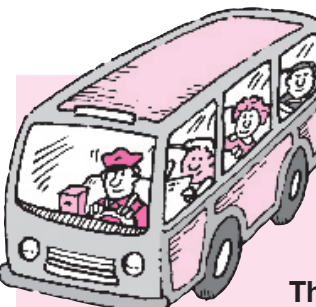


Murders 4 You presents "Bon Voyage, Auntie Lulu!"

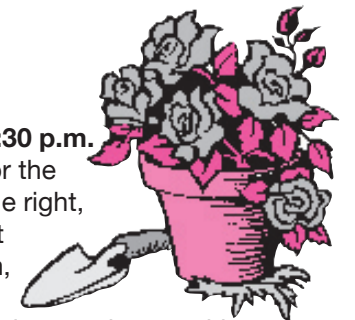

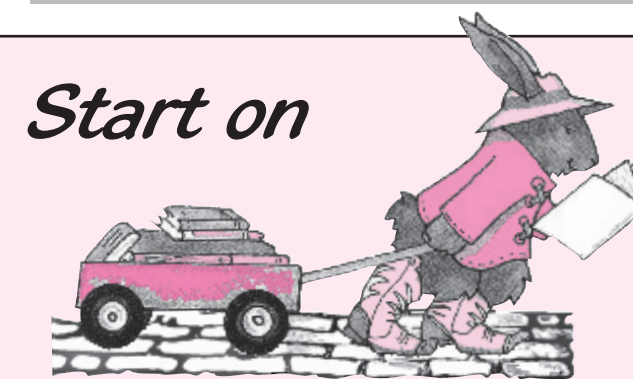

ADD/ADHD: Practical Solutions

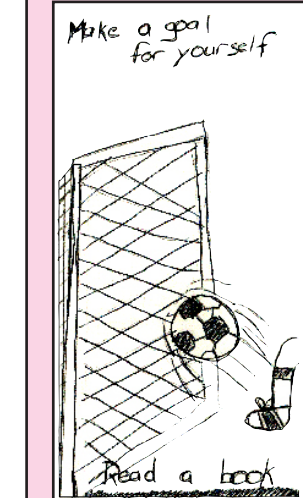

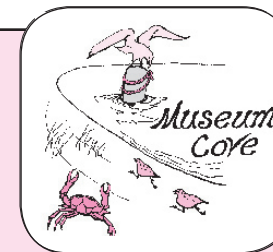

In The Museum Cove

Journey Through Space

The Museum Cove at the Northport Public Library continues in its sixth year as a specially designed learning environment for our community's children with an exciting exhibit of discovery entitled "Journey Through Space." The exhibit will feature displays from the Vanderbilt Planetarium and the Cradle of Aviation Museum.

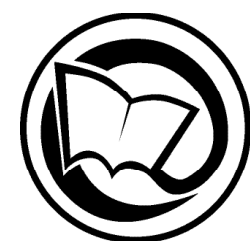
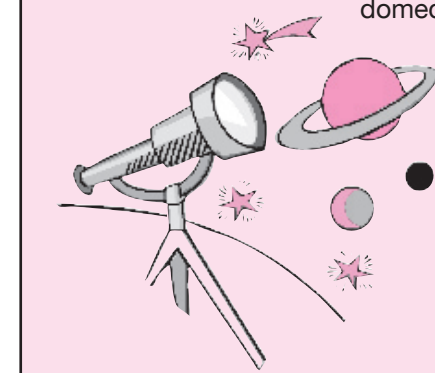
Children will learn about our solar system through displays prepared by the Vanderbilt Planetarium of Centerport. The Vanderbilt Planetarium opened in 1971 on the grounds of the Vanderbilt estate. Visitors to the Planetarium learn about the nighttime sky in the domed 60-foot Sky Theater. The theater's GOTO star projector can display the sun, moon, stars and planets. It also recreates celestial events during various Sky Shows. The history of flight—culminating

in the importance of Long Island in the development of space vehicles—will be explained through murals and displays prepared by the Cradle of Aviation Museum located in Garden City.

The Cradle of Aviation Museum boasts eight galleries with 70 air and spacecraft—from hot air balloons to an actual lunar module. Visit the museum to see the "Exploring Space," "Long Island to the Moon," and "Mars Virtual Voyage" exhibits. The Northport Library's Museum Cove exhibit "Journey Through Space" begins September 12 and continues until the end of December. Come into The Museum Cove to see telescopes, an Orrey star projector, models of the solar system, puzzles, book lists, and models of spacecraft. Check the Library's monthly newsletter for details on related programs and activities scheduled throughout the fall.

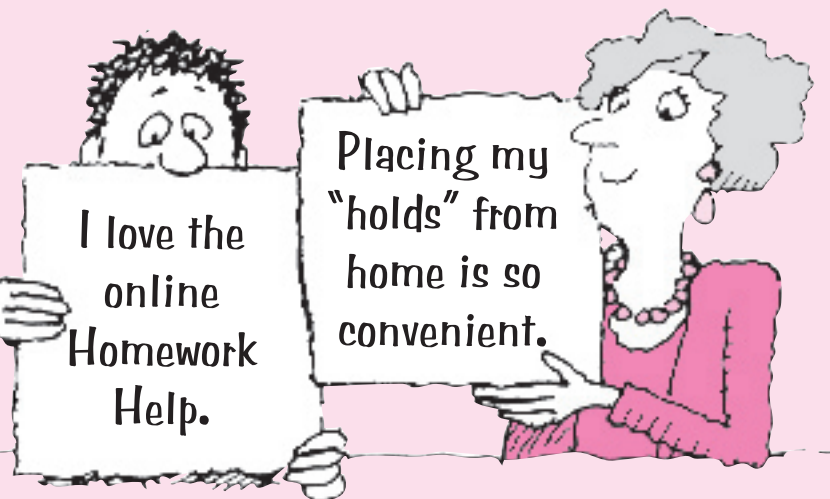
