(N) Friday, September 1, 7:30 p.m.



This multi-session program is offered by the Suffolk County Department of Health Services and is based on the CDC's Clinical Practice Guidelines for treating nicotine dependence. The cessation program provides important information about the three aspects of nicotine dependence: biological, psychological, and behavioral. The emphasis is on *preparing* to quit. Those who use all forms of tobacco products (including cigarettes, cigars, pipes, e-cigarettes, and chew tobacco) are welcome. Recovery Month



National Recovery Month is held annually in September by Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA). Medicine Collection



(N & EN) Thursday, September 7, 3:30–6:30 p.m.

The Northport Police Department and the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office will collect unused or expired prescription and over-the-counter medications. Proper disposal of these items is essential for risk reduction and environmental protection. No questions asked and no personal information is required.

Only medications in **pill** form will be accepted and must be placed in a plastic bag before arrival. Ask an Adult Services Librarian for a handout of places to safely dispose of medical sharps.

Mental Health Fair

Meet with local organizations to learn about prevention, education, and recovery resources for people living with mental health and substance use disorders, their loved ones, and our community. Recovery is possible!

Opioid Overdose Prevention Training, 4:00–6:30 p.m.

CN Guidance & Counseling Services will provide training for interested adults (16 years and older) on how to recognize the signs of an opioid overdose and administer Naloxone (Narcan). No registration required; just stop by the table.
