Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches parents/guardians and adults who work with youth (ages 12–18) how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illness and substance use disorders.

Facilitated by CN Guidance & Counseling Services, this two-session training is designed to give you the skills to reach out and provide initial support to adolescents who may be developing a mental health-related crisis, and help connect them to the appropriate care. 


Cinema at the Library: Asteroid City
