Be a Library Smart Parent!

Encourage Your Children to Join the Library's Summer Reading Club



Each year, the Children's and Young Adult departments celebrate summer with reading clubs that revolve around themes. Any child can join the reading clubs. Children as young as two years old have participated. Books are read to preschoolers in the "Read to Me Club" by parents, grandparents, baby-sitters, and siblings. Children in grades K-3 who join the club are encouraged to read on their own. Older children, grades 4 and up, contract with us for the number of books they hope to read on their own. Children who are entering sixth grade can continue to participate as "contract kids," others choose to join the Young Adult Summer Reading Club, and some *do both*. Incentives are earned for each book the child reads and shares with the Summer Reading Club Staff.



Summer reading clubs are not only fun, they are essential. An early introduction to books and involvement in reading programs does make a difference in a child's life. Children who read regu-

larly and during summer vacations, maintain and significantly improve their reading skills. Recent research indicates that elementary-aged children can lose as much as four months' progress in reading skills during summer vacations if they don't read regularly.



One of the goals of the summer reading clubs is to help children experience a feeling of accomplishment . . . so August is the month for celebration. The children who complete their reading commitments attend closing parties featuring special performances and refreshments.



Youngsters about to enter the sixth grade are encouraged to "move up" to the Young Adult Summer Reading Program for middle schoolers. This is *their* time to discover the riches available in the Young Adult Corner. Exploring the "upstairs" of the library as part of summer leisure time also helps new middle schoolers. Come September, when homework assignments are underway, resources and staff are now friendly and familiar.



An unlimited opportunity to explore, learn, create, investigate, socialize, and read is localized in the library. Encourage and support your children's reading interests and curiosity so reading remains an enjoyable challenge.



Visit the public library often. Let your child discover the adventure and fun of choosing books from the library's collection. Be sure that each child has his/her own library card. In the Northport-East Northport library district, children are eligible for library cards from the day they are born.
