

Love, Etty: The Journal of Etty Hillesum

one-act play performed by Jane Smith Bernhardt Friday, November 17, 8:00 p.m.

Etty Hillesum was a Dutch Jewish woman who died in the Auschwitz extermination camp 50 years ago. An Interrupted Life, her story as documented in a diary and a collection of letters, was published in the United States in 1983. It details Etty's experiences during the early days of the Nazi occupation of Amsterdam and her time at the Westerbrook transport camp in Holland. Two years ago, her story came to life on stage with actress Jane Smith Bernhardt perform-



ing selected sections of Etty's journal in a one-act play. Ms. Bernhardt brings Etty's story to Northport after performing for almost three years in regional theatres, schools, temples, and churches in the Northeast. She is a portrait artist and a graduate of the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, who says Etty Hillesum's journal changed her life. Come see why.

Tickets, which go on sale Nov. 4, are \$1.00 for adults, 50¢ for students, senior citizens, and persons who are disabled.




are one of the many types of compact disc software programs played daily at the library. In *Arthur's Teacher Trouble* characters and objects come alive. *Arthur's*
