The Northport Piano Trio returns for its fourth season here at the library following a European concert debut. According to Walter Schneider, the group's founder, each of the artists enjoys coming "home" to Northport-East Northport Public Library, as all three have worked or lived in our neighborhood. Cellist Gary Beck is a 1982 Northport High School graduate. He is principal cellist in the New York University Orchestra and the Stony Brook Undergraduate Orchestra. Gary also performs with the South Shore Symphony and has toured around the world as principal cellist with the Long Island Youth Orchestra.

Katherine LoMonaco is an award-winning violinist. She teaches in the Plainedge School District. She has performed in many orchestras including the New Orleans Ballet Symphony, and co-founded the Louisiana Chamber Orchestra.

Pianist Walter Schneider has founded many musical groups including the Northport Artists, Writers, and Musicians Support Group. He teaches high school music and created the first School Electronic Music Course in New York State.

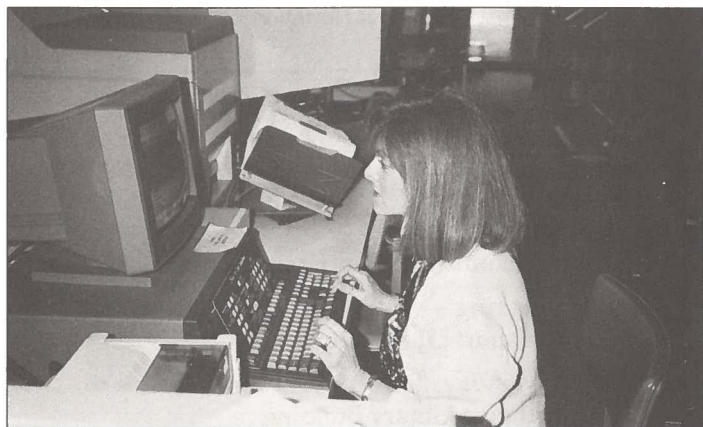

DISCover CD-ROM for Reference

CD-ROM is an acronym for Compact Disc Read Only Memory. That is, you can read data from the disc but you can't write to or erase it. A CD-ROM is exactly the same in size, shape, and appearance as a music compact disc. CD-ROM discs, which run on personal computers, allow you to search, view, and print the latest information on a topic. A single disc can hold some 300,000 pages of information! For example, the entire *Compton's Encyclopedia — all 26 volumes — fits on a single CD-ROM, and offers sound in addition to the text and graphics available in the print version.

You can access a huge amount of information in CD-ROM format with incomparable speed relative to print. Also, the medium is often a much more economical and efficient means of information distribution than paper. Data on CD-ROM is both durable and secure. Unless deliberately abused, the discs are virtually indestructible and, with proper care, will last indefinitely. It's no wonder that CD products in libraries are becoming basic resources for patrons' ready reference needs. Your reference librarians are happy to help you discover these CD-ROM resources.

Newsday on CD-ROM enables you to read and print out the full text of all news stories, features, columns, editorials, letters to the editor, and some wire stories from *Newsday* and *New York Newsday*.



InfoTrac General Periodicals Index accesses information from magazines on current events, lifestyle, people in the news, sports, economics, consumer events, world affairs, public health, business trends, entertainment, and travel.



InfoTrac National Newspaper Index provides similar information from newspapers.



InfoTrac Health Reference Center lets you checkup on the latest medical and health information. This CD-ROM database indexes and selectively abstracts medical journal articles, and provides definitions from medical reference books and full text of numerous health association pamphlets.



ProDirect lists the phone numbers of businesses throughout the country. Let your fingers do the keyboarding!



Books in Suffolk itemizes the book holdings of the public libraries in Suffolk County, the Suffolk Cooperative Library System, and the three campuses of Suffolk Community College. There are more than 550,000 titles listed, representing nearly four million books and more than 70,000 government documents. Your library can borrow most of the books listed on *Books in Suffolk* through interlibrary loan cooperative networks.



The library is a participant in *CD-NET*, the local area network managed by the Suffolk Cooperative Library System. Through this electronic "highway," your reference librarians can access material from a variety of databases including the financials of public companies on *Compact Disclosure*, import and export statistics from the *National Trade Data Bank*, and census tract data from the 1990 *Census of Population*.

Your librarians are user friendly and eager to help. Just ask!

*The CD-ROM *Compton's MultiMedia Encyclopedia* is available in the Children's Room at Northport.

Each April, the Library Board of Trustees calls on the community to vote on the annual operating budget for the next fiscal year and to elect a trustee. You should know these important voting facts:

Vote — Monday, April 19, 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m.
Northport Library Building

Who Can Vote — anyone who is

1. At least 18 years of age;
2. A citizen of the United States;
3. A resident of the Northport-East Northport School District for at least 30 days;
4. Registered to vote.

If you have not voted within four years in a general, school, or library election, reregistration is required.

Registration may be made in person prior to April 14 at the following locations: 1) any school in the district between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., any day that school is in session; 2) the offices of the School District Clerk, 110 Elwood Road, Northport, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

You may register prior to April 9 at the Suffolk County Board of Elections, Yaphank Ave., Yaphank, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

You may register by mail using application forms available in both library buildings. Applications must be received at the Suffolk County Board of Elections no later than March 25.

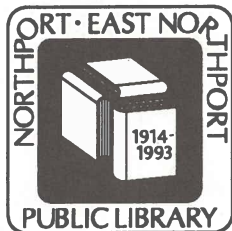
