In preparation for the October P.S.A.T. examination, the library is offering a 4-part mini-series designed to sharpen your math and verbal skills. Instructors Willis L. Osborn (verbal) and Maryann Martinucci (math) have successfully tutored scores of students in preparation for the S.A.T. and P.S.A.T. examinations. Registration begins September 5.

What's available for my infant, toddler, and preschooler?

From infancy children can be encouraged to develop an interest in reading and learning. *Preschoolers' Door to Learning*, through its carefully constructed progression of programs, for children and for parents and children together, aims to develop pre-reading concepts as well as listening, viewing, and thinking skills. Register your child for:

MOTHER/INFANT DISCUSSION GROUP

(Ages 2-12 months with their mother)

Mothers discuss infant development in a social environment with other mothers.

LAPTIME

(Ages 12-18 months with a parent)*

With your child on your lap, share fingerplays and songs.

MOTHER GOOSE

(Ages 18-24 months with a parent)*

Through play, children interact with other children outside the home.

PARENT/CHILD WORKSHOP

(Ages 2-2¹/₂ years)*

Play with your child and explore a different child-related topic each week with a guest specialist.

MOMMY & ME

(Ages 2-3 years)*

Stories for listening, songs for singing, puppets for playing — all in preparation for the next step: "on my own" at storytime!

TODDLER TIME

(Ages 2¹/₂-3¹/₂ years)

A first "on my own" storytime, featuring flannel board stories, books, music, crafts, puppets and games.

PRESCHOOL STORYTIME

(Ages 3¹/₂-5 years)

Storytime adventures with books, music, crafts, flannel board stories, and puppets.

FUN FOR PRESCHOOLERS

(Ages 3¹/₂-5 years)

An early step to nursery school with music, crafts, stories, and games presented by a certified nursery school teacher.

STORY PARADE (Grades K-4)

Offers elementary students help in organizing their study skills.

CRAFT WORKSHOPS

A variety of creative activities are offered throughout the year for every age group.

COMPUTER HELP

Designed for children who read on their own as well as children who have books read to them.

What's available for my young adult?

A lively, attractive **YA CORNER** draws teenagers to new books, paperbacks and magazines. Nearby is the **HOMEWORK CENTER**, an area equipped with basic reference tools as well as School Assignment Alert materials. **PC STATION** offers a collection of young adult and career-oriented computer programs. The young adult librarians and the reference librarians are always available to help in the use of the library's varied resources.

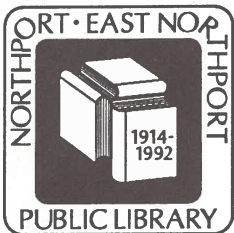
