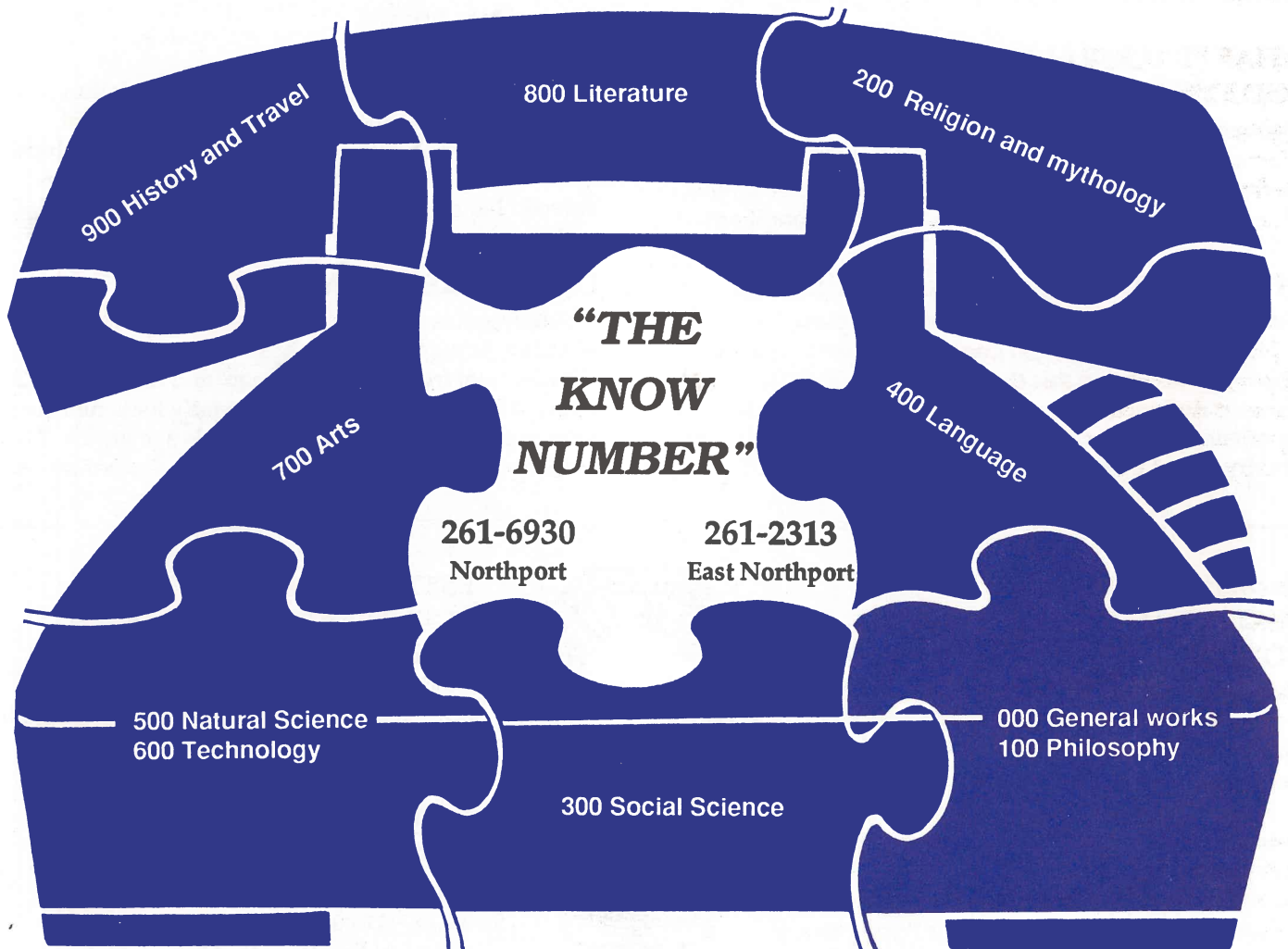

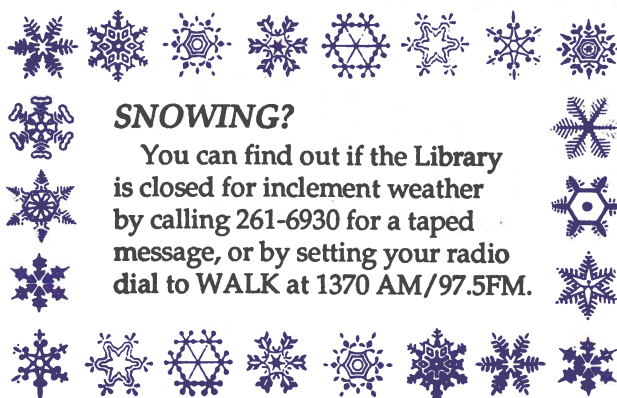

OPEN FOR DISCUSSION

Our book discussion groups encourage patrons to contribute and to share their ideas. Refreshments are served. Join us for an afternoon designed to involve, engage, and challenge all of our readers.

BOOK & SANDWICH (W)RAP, our short story discussion group, meets in the East Northport Library on the 1st Thursday of the month, from September through May. Molly Schoen, East Northport Branch Librarian, who introduced Book & Sandwich (W)rap in 1982, selects the materials and moderates the discussions. The group has read stories from almost every country, culture, and ethnic group.

A new series of Book & Sandwich (W)rap will begin Thursday, February 1. Please register and pick up your materials at the East Northport Library beginning January 16.

NOVEL IDEAS, an adult book discussion group, has been in existence for 6 years, and meets in the Northport Library on the 2nd Friday of each month from October through May. Reference Librarian Dodie Gillman moderates these discussions. A contemporary novel is discussed each month, with the series usually including an award winner, a first work, and a work by a non-American author. Books are provided for the participants when they register with Dodie Gillman at the Northport Library.

Moon Tiger by Penelope Lively will be the subject of this month's discussion on Friday, January 12 at 1:00 p.m.

JOURNEY INTO BOOKS, our discussion group for grades 6 through 12, meets under the direction of Young Adult Librarian Marcia Hunt at the Northport Library on the 3rd Friday of each month, from September through May. Evolving out of "The Write Stuff", our Young Adult creative writing contest, this program enables teens not only to preview some of the newest titles in our YA collection, but also to write brief reactions to these books, and to share their reactions with other members of the group. These captions are then compiled and made available in book form as an aid to all our patrons in selecting new YA fiction. 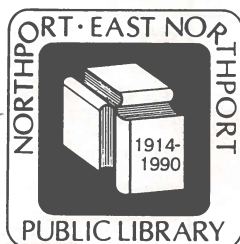
