A LIBRARY CARD is issued free of charge to any resident or taxpayer of Northport-East Northport School District #4. Current proof of residency or ownership (e.g. driver's license, tax or phone bill) must be shown. A child under the age of 12 must have his/her registration form signed by a parent or guardian. A juvenile card is issued to a child of any age, and may be used to borrow material from the children's collection. Adult borrowing privileges are extended to a child under the age of 12 upon the request of a parent or guardian.

Your library card may be used immediately, and is valid for 2 years. To renew an expired card, your registration must be free of fines and overdue books. You will again be asked to show proof of residency or ownership.

You are responsible for all materials checked out on your library card. It is important, therefore, for you to notify us immediately if your card is lost or stolen. There is a fee of \$2.00 for a replacement card.

YOUNG PERFORMERS SHOWCASE

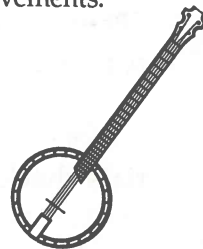
Thursday, September 21, 7:00 p.m.

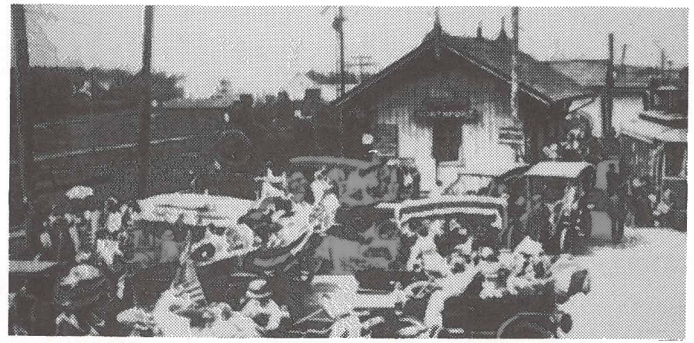

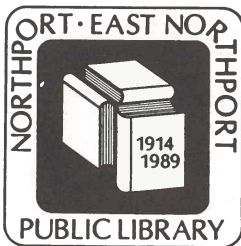
