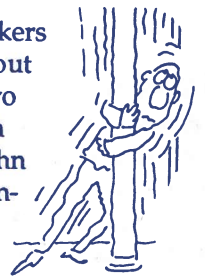


THE OTHER VIC THEATRE COMPANY PRESENTS CONTINENTAL DIVIDE

JAZZ PIANIST BROSS TOWNSEND

Eventually, he specialized in arranging and composition at the Cleveland Institute of Music. Mr. Townsend quickly developed a reputation as a favored accompanist for blues vocalists including Dinah Washington, Little Jimmy Scott, Gladys Knight, and Diana Ross. He has performed extensively in night clubs, on concert stages, and with Broadway performances. Vote — Tuesday, April 5, from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Northport Public Library

Trustee — One library trustee will be elected for a five year term

Who Can Vote — anyone who is

1. At least 18 years of age;
2. A citizen of the United States;
3. A resident of the Northport-East Northport School District for at least 30 days;
4. Registered to vote.

Reregistration is required if a person has not voted within two years in a general, school, or library election. Registration may be made in person at the following locations: 1) any school in the district between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., any day that school is in session; 2) the offices of the School District Clerk, 110 Elwood Road, Northport, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; 3) the Suffolk County Board of Elections, Yaphank Avenue, Yaphank, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; or 4) by mail to the Suffolk County Board of Elections using application forms available at both library buildings.
