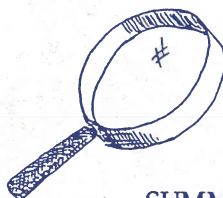

NON-DRIVER IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Friday, June 10, 10:00-12:00 noon

Are you a non-driver? Not having a driver's license can sometimes be a problem. On Friday, June 10, the library will sponsor project "Reaching Out," a New York State Department of Motor Vehicles service which provides non-driver photo identification cards. In order to participate in this program, you must register and receive an application beginning Saturday, May 28.

Applicants for a non-driver I.D. must be over 18 years old and have proof of age (birth certificate, medical card, etc.) and proof of address (LILCO bill, library card, etc.). If I.D. will replace your driver's license, bring the license with you. A check made out to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles is also required. The fee will be between \$6.00 and \$6.50. Do not fill in the amount until the program date. Each applicant will receive a temporary identification card. The permanent photo identification will be mailed to your home address within 45 days.

ELDERHOSTEL: CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR OLDER ADULTS

Friday, June 17, 2:00 p.m.

Dinah Lindauer, retired Assistant Director of the Nassau Library System, will present a slide show/talk on the Elderhostel program that started in 1975 and now involves more than 100,000 older adults. Elderhostel is a network of more than 850 colleges, universities, and other educational institutions which offer low-cost, short-term, residential academic programs for seniors, regardless of educational background. Mrs. Lindauer started Elderhostling in 1983 and has enjoyed programs at Yale, Williams, Hampshire, and other colleges in the United States and abroad. Catalogs describing the wide range of Elderhostel activities will be available at the program.

Both the Northport and East Northport libraries own a Leading Edge Model D computer for patron use. Each computer has about 10 programs on the hard disk. Patrons may not use their own programs on the computers. There is no charge or time limit, however, we ask that you limit your time to an hour if others are waiting. CREATIVE WRITING WORKSHOP

Tuesdays, July 5, 12, 19 & 26, 1:30-2:30 p.m.
(Grades 6-8)

Pam Conrad, a prize-winning Long Island author of children's and young adult books, will conduct this workshop series. Her young adult books include *Prairie Songs*, which won the International Reading Association Award (1986), *What I Did For Roman*, named a best book for 1987 by the American Library Association, and *Holding Me Here* about which *School Library Journal* says, "This isn't just a gripping page turner, although it includes mystery, intrigue and suspense. Nor is this merely a sensitive and original young adult problem novel ... Conrad gives readers all this with fine writing besides."

Mrs. Conrad's enthusiasm and ability to inspire young adult writers should guarantee a dynamic series. Limited registration. Sign-up begins June 13 at both libraries.

VIDEO VIEWS

Summer is almost here and for some it will mean time to do things we haven't gotten around to during the winter months. Let our videos help you get started.
