LIBRARY WELCOMES NEW DIRECTOR

The Board of Trustees of the Northport-East Northport Public Library is pleased to announce the appointment of Stephanie Heineman as Library Director.



Mrs. Heineman has served for the past 18 years as Assistant Director of the Middle Country Public Library, one of Long Island's largest and busiest public libraries. As Assistant Director, Mrs. Heineman guided Middle Country through the construction and eventual renovation of its Main Library and the development and refurbishing of its Cultural Center. Before assuming her position at Middle Country, Mrs. Heineman worked as a Reference Librarian at Ohio University, Athens, Ohio, and as a Special Librarian at the American Association of Advertising Agencies in New York City. Mrs. Heineman received her Bachelor of Arts degree from the State University of New York at Albany, and her Master of Library Science degree from Simmons College, Boston, Massachusetts.

Stephanie Heineman currently serves as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Long Island Library Resources Council, and is co-chairperson of the User's Group for Gaylord System 6, a computerized circulation control system used in 22 public libraries in Suffolk County. She is an active member of several Suffolk Cooperative Library System committees, including the Committee on Planning Microcomputer Services for Suffolk Libraries and the Adult Services Network. She is also a member of the Suffolk Coalition For Parents and Children.

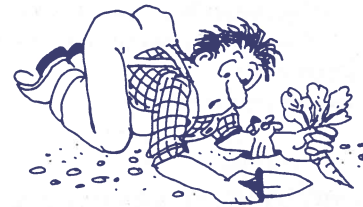

Health insurance coverage has become increasingly complicated for older Americans. Mr. McManus will answer questions about Medicare and supplemental Medicare health insurance. He will also help fill out Medicare claims and appeals, help determine Medicaid eligibility and refer beneficiaries with complex Medicare problems to the appropriate resources for assistance. Each publication provides background information, important court decisions, State and Federal laws, current and past statistics, public opinion polls, pros and cons, and world comparisons on these issues.
