Meditation as a Healing Practice



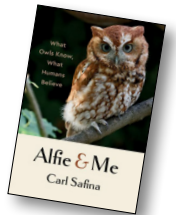

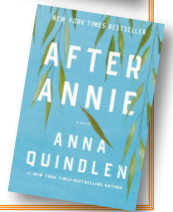

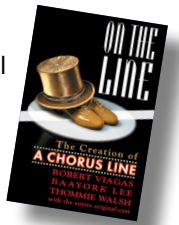


"On the Line:

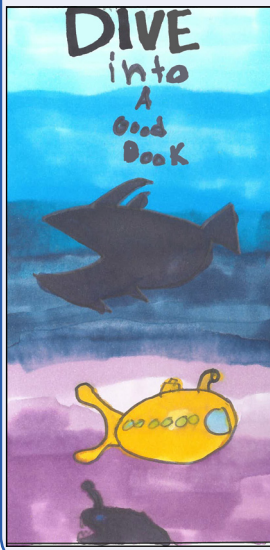


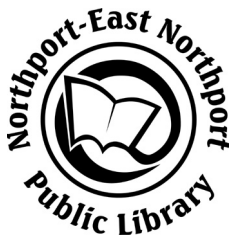
