

# CELEBRATING **100 YEARS** IN THE COMMUNITY

From the spring of 1914 when its state charter was granted to WWII when the Red Cross used its meeting room to prepare surgical dressings, to the autumn of 2012 when it was a source of refuge and information after Superstorm Sandy, the Northport-East Northport Public Library has been an integral part of the community.

Our story began in 1880 in the basement of Northport's Presbyterian Church where the newly-founded Northport Literary and Social Union debated issues of the day. Over the next three decades, the Union looked toward establishing a free public library for the entire community, survived a series of financial and membership crises, and moved into the Opera House on Union Place. Fundraising by volunteers, a \$10,000 grant from the Carnegie Corporation, and a community resolution to secure ongoing funding for a public library resulted in the purchase of a lot on the corner of Main Street and Woodside Avenue. In June 1914, the Northport Public Library received its New York State charter and the new Library building at 215 Main Street celebrated its official opening the following year.

In 1939, a growing East Northport community saw the need for its own Library and established the Library Association of East Northport. In 1940, the East Northport Public Library officially opened in the old East Northport School building as a branch of the Northport Public Library.

During World War II and in the years that followed, the Library added resources and services in response to both a nationwide movement to improve public libraries and the community's population surge. The book collection grew from 10,000 volumes in 1945 to more than 40,000 in 1960. In 1945 the East Northport Library was destroyed by fire and in 1949 a new building was erected on the same site.

By 1960, the population served by the Library had grown to 28,000. To accommodate that growth, members of the community voted to purchase land for a new Library building at the corner of Laurel and Scudder Avenues. Construction was completed on the new Northport building in 1966, and an extension was also added to the East Northport building.

The new and spacious buildings filled rapidly in response to a community with diverse interests, and a proliferation of informational resources and technological innovation. By 1995, videos, audiobooks, CDs, and computers were having an impact on the Library's facilities. It became clear that larger facilities were needed to house collections, and that more public space was needed for meetings and programs. In 1995, a bond vote was overwhelmingly passed to build a new East Northport building and to renovate and expand the Northport building. The new buildings opened in 1997 and 1998, respectively.

As the Northport-East Northport Public Library celebrates 100 years of meeting the educational, informational, and cultural needs of an entire community, we would like to express our appreciation for those dedicated to fulfilling this vision. We look forward to continuing the tradition of superior Library service for the next 100 years.

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
