

Ms. Griswold, a Long Islander, tells the fascinating and hidden story of Sylvester Manor, the 1650s former plantation on Shelter Island that has been home to 11 generations of the Sylvester family and was one of the earliest plantations in the North, dependent for nearly two centuries upon the labor of slaves. Critics have described The Manor as a "flawlessly researched book" and "a work of enormous importance and energy, erudition and humanity." The Christian Science Monitor called The Manor "a transcendent saga about the power of history and place, about who we were as a people, centuries before, and how that identity is part of who we became."






