**It All Adds Up!**  
 Summer Reading Clubs are not only fun, they are essential. Early involvement in reading programs makes a difference in a child's life. Studies have found that children who read more than ten books during the summer vacation make significant gains in reading ability compared with those who read fewer. A reading program based on a fun theme is a great way to encourage and support your child's reading interests and curiosity so that reading remains an enjoyable challenge. VISIT YOUR PUBLIC LIBRARY OFTEN. Help your child discover the adventure and fun of choosing books from the Library's collections. Be sure that children have their own Library cards. At the Northport-East Northport Public Library, children are eligible for Library cards from the day they are born!

**Count on Great Books!**  
 Our Librarians for Children and Teens have constructed unique programs that make summertime reading fun for all ages. They will be happy to help your children discover new books and expand their reading horizons.

**Do the Math!**  
 Any child can join the reading clubs. Choose the club that's right for each age group:  
**Read to Your Baby**—enjoy reading to your child who is newborn to 2 years of age  
**Birthday Buddies**—books are read to preschoolers by parents, grandparents, siblings, and babysitters  
**Sensational Centennials**—children entering grades 1-3  
**The Won Hundreds**—children entering grades 4-6  
**The Teen Reading Club**—teens entering grades 6-12  
 Teens who participate in the Summer Reading Club have an added benefit: they will become familiar with the friendly staff and resources available to them throughout the Library. This will be helpful in September when homework assignments are underway once again.

**To Sum it Up:**  
 A record number of children and teens participated in last year's summer reading program. Discover unlimited opportunities to explore, learn, create, investigate, socialize, and read in the Library.

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
