

Check Out What You've "Checked Out" with your "Reading History"

Have you ever started a new book only to wonder why it seems so familiar? Have you forgotten which movies you've watched since the beginning of the year? Are you reading the new Robert Parker series in order, but can't recall where you left off? There is a solution to these dilemmas: your **Reading History**.

Your **Reading History** is a feature of the Library's online catalog. A reading history is a list of all of the items-books, DVDs, CDs, and audiobooks—that you have taken out. This feature is available at the library or from home. Visit our website at www.nenpl.org and click on the View Your Record link on the left hand side of the page, then enter your library barcode (or username) and password. Once you are in your patron record. click on the **Reading History** link, then click on the "Opt In" button. Because this is an optional feature you have the ability to delete your entire Reading listory or to delete individual entries.

Are You a List Maker? The My Lists feature of the

Library's online catalog is a great way to organize what you've already read or what you want to read in the future. Here's how to use My Lists:

- Search the Library catalog and locate an item that you would like to add to your wish list.
- Click on the title of the item.
- Click "Add to My Lists" at the top of the catalog page. Login to your Library account with your barcode (or username) and password
- You can now "Save Records to a List." Click on the drop-down arrow, you will have the option to select a list you have already created or to "Create a New List." When you "Create a New List," you enter a List Name, then click submit.
- A message will display confirming that the title has been saved to your list.



A Treasure-Trove of Fiction



From murder mysteries to love stories, Long Island has been the backdrop for a treasure-trove of fiction. Here is a sampling from the Library's collection.

After This by Alice McDermott

This portrait of an American family during the middle decades of the 20th century evokes the social, spiritual, and political turmoil of the era.

Aloft by Chang-rae Lee

A visit from his daughter and her fiancé prompts Jerry Battle to reassess his life and relationships as he reflects on his professional success and his love of flying solo.

Amagansett by Mark Mills

Conrad Labarde, a reclusive fisherman, finds his life transformed when he pulls up the body of a beautiful young woman in his fishing nets.

As Husbands Go by Susan Isaacs

Astonished when her seemingly devoted husband is found murdered in a prostitute's apartment, Susie bristles at her neighbors' mixed reactions and sets out to restore her family's honor.

Beach Road by James Patterson

Hoping to revamp his career when he is hired to represent a triple-murder suspect, Montauk lawyer Tom Dunleavy finds the case complicated by his client's popularity and a dangerous secret being protected by East Hampton's privileged class.

The Fourth Victim by Tony Spinosa

After four truck drivers are robbed and murdered, the identity of the fourth victim compels former policemen Joe Serpe and Bob Healy to start their own investigation into the killings.

The Gate House by Nelson DeMille

This seguel to The Gold Coast follows the homecoming of John Sutter, who finds himself living in close proximity to his ex-wife Susan and is targeted by her dead lover's mafia son.

The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald

F. Scott Fitzgerald's classic tale set in the Roaring Twenties is about a newly-rich young man who tries to recapture the past and win back his former love.

Jacob's Folly by Rebecca Miller

An 18th century Jewish peddler is reincarnated as a fly in present-day Long Island, and becomes involved in the lives of

Lapham Rising by Roger Rosenblatt

An eccentric writer living as a recluse with his talking dog comes up with a scheme to take on his irritating new neighbor.

Red like Wine: The North Fork Harbor Vineyard Murders by Joseph Finora

Crime writer Vin Gusto and his former girlfriend discover that more than wine is being made at the local vineyard.

Summer Reading by Hilma Wolitzer




