# New York's Native Freshwater Fish, Reptiles, and Amphibians

The Library is delighted to be partnering with the Cold Spring Harbor Fish Hatchery & Aquarium, a not-for-profit environmental organization located just across the border in Nassau County. The Hatchery, which opened in 1883 as a New York State hatchery, now entertains and educates visitors with its exhibits, demonstrations, and animal displays. Situated between St. John's Pond and the Long Island Sound, this unique center has eight outdoor ponds stocked with different species of fish and two aquarium buildings that house a large living collection of New York State freshwater reptiles, fish, and amphibians. The grounds are beautiful to visit, and numerous activities and events throughout the year promise that there is always something for children and adults to see and do at the

For this current Museum Cove exhibit, the display case is filled with information about native wildlife, including some taxidermal specimens on loan from the Hatchery. On the walls of the Museum Cove are large photographs of the Hatchery

wildlife. Environmental educators will be presenting several programs at the Library highlighting the aquatic ecology of Long Island.






