Health Insurance Counseling

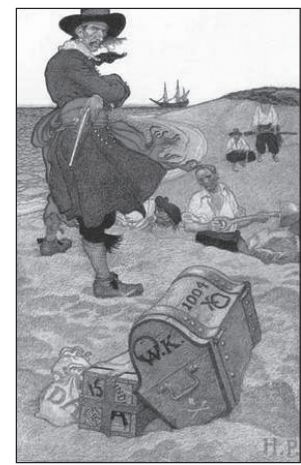

A "Green" Update

Environmentally sustainable or "green" practices have long been a priority for the Library. Two recent equipment installations have added to our "green" profile. The halogen bulbs in the Northport Library Gallery have been replaced with high-efficiency LED lights. The gallery lighting can now be controlled independently from the seating lighting, providing a more dramatic display, particularly in the evening.

A new, high-efficiency HVAC system for the Northport Community Room (partially funded by a state grant and eligible for a LIPA energy rebate) was installed to replace a 14-year-old, failing unit. The new system benefits from technological advances which allow it to adjust output based on room occupancy—comfort and conservation!

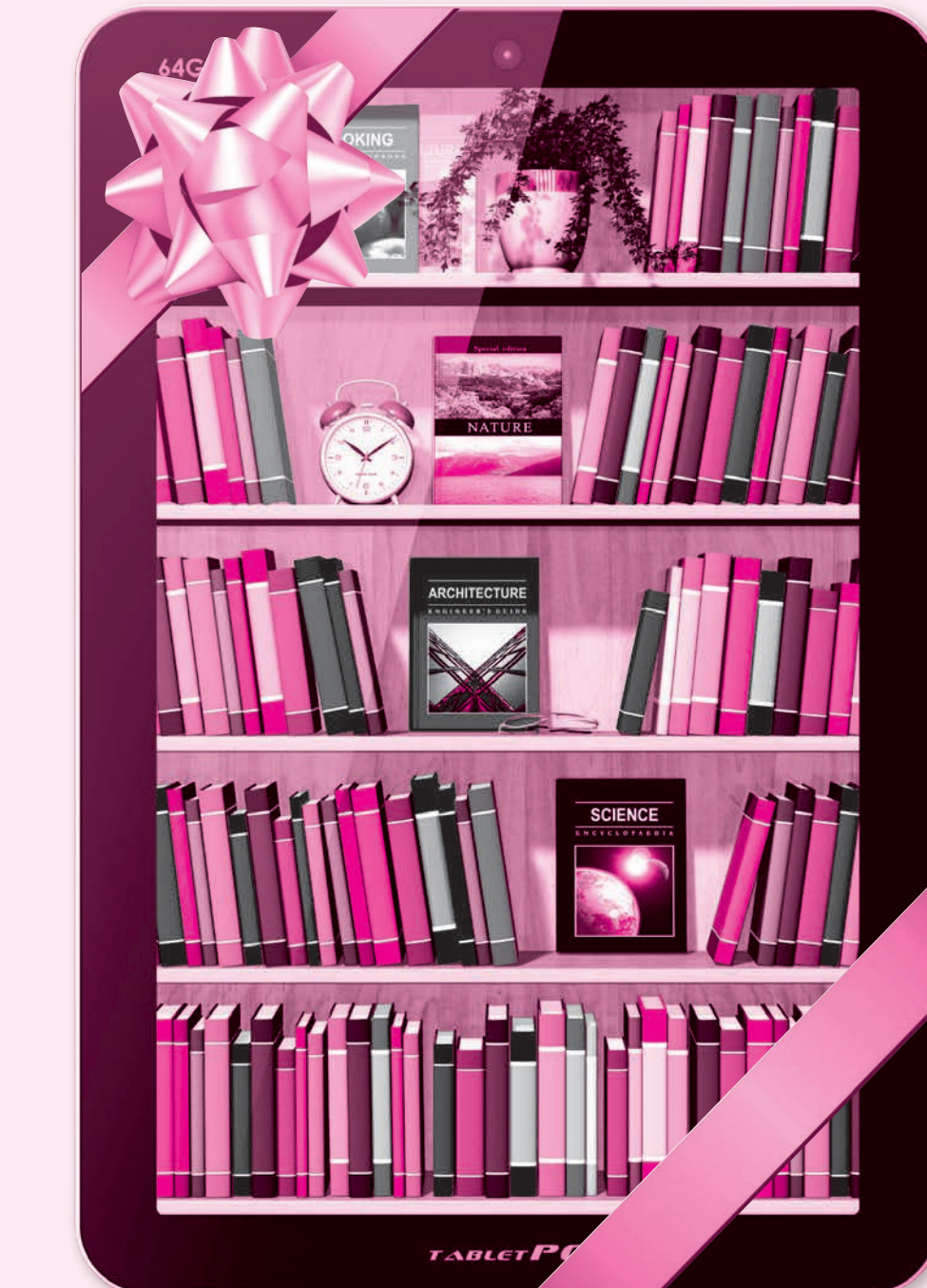
