

NextReads is available with a free online subscription through the Library's website and provides email newsletters in more than 20 fiction and nonfiction

categories including Mystery, Biography, Historical Fiction, Science Fiction, Business, Popular Culture, Kids Books, and Teen Scene, among others. Each newsletter includes recently released titles as well as older books "you may have missed."

Subscribe to one, some, or all of the newsletters, or simply read them online. Begin at the Library's website www.nenpl.org, click on "Online Research," then click on **Databases A-Z** and scroll down to the NextReads link. Each newsletter is linked to the Library's catalog, conveniently allowing you to request the books that interest you.

Here's a sampling of recent NextReads newsletter

Fiction A to Z newsletter: Swamplandia by Karen Russell

Ghosts, alligator wrestling, a bird man, and a theme park are the underpinnings of this tale, set in the Florida Everglades, of an eccentric family struggling with grief in the aftermath of their mother's death.

Thrillers and Suspense newsletter: The Informationist by Taylor Stevens

Likened by some reviewers to Steig Larsson's Lisbeth Salander, heroine Vanessa Munroe earns her living by passing on information to well-paying clients. Fast-paced and gritty, this read is a real page turner.

Audiobooks newsletter:

I Think I Love You by Allison Pearson

This is the funny, poignant tale of a divorced, single mom who wins the "The Ultimate David Cassidy Quiz"-25 years after her teen crush has waned. Laugh and relate as she sets out to claim her prize.

Popular Culture newsletter: Apollo's Angels by Jennifer Homans

Written by a former professional ballerinaturned-dance-critic, this beautifully illustrated history explores the art form and notable artists of dance including Balanchine, Taglioni, and Fonteyn.

Kids' Books newsletter:

Liar, Liar by Gary Paulsen Eighth-grader Kevin is a very good liar—and he thinks that he's doing everyone a favor by telling them what they want to hear. Full of humor and wacky mishaps, this fast-paced read is a winner.


Teen Scene newsletter:
