

Build early learning skills with your baby or toddler while having fun. By sharing books with your children you show them reading is important and you are actually helping them get ready to read. Children's learning starts at home and you are your child's first and best teacher. We encourage you to introduce your baby or toddler to the magic and wonder of books. Our Children's Librarians will be happy to provide you with book suggestions. Come into the library beginning July 1 and receive a reading record and bookmark to get you started. Originally from the street corners of Brooklyn, The Precisions hit the national record charts with their 1962 arrangement of George and Ira Gershwin's "Someone to Watch Over Me." While under contract in the 1960s with Golden Crest Records, The Precisions performed with top artists of the era including Alan Freed, Murray the K, and the WABC "All Americans" in appearances at the Brooklyn Fox, the New York Paramount, and the legendary Apollo Theater. The group re-formed in 1996 with members Phil Ferrito and Bob Falco (vocals), Al Frazia (bass & vocals), Robbie Falco (drums), and Frankie Carr, former star of the Broadway hit "Beatlemania."

In 1976 she joined the staff of the Northport-East Northport Public Library as a Young Adult and Audio-Visual Librarian. She was appointed East Northport Branch Librarian in 1980 and Assistant Director of the Library in 1981. She has served in that capacity until now. In addition to taking an active role in the construction and renovation of two library buildings, Mrs. Minogue administered personnel and human resources to the staff, coordinated collection development, oversaw the collection budget and expenditures, and assisted the Director in running a Library that serves a community of more than 36,000 residents.

"I am looking forward to carrying on the 'tradition of excellence' that retiring Director Stephanie Heineman has forged," said Mrs. Minogue. "My love for this community deepens with each passing year, and its welfare remains my highest priority.
