

Encore: When You Want More from Your Search

Encore is a friendly interface for searching the County Catalog and beyond. With Encore you will be able to find books, articles, images, DVDs-even chapters from reference books—using features which quickly narrow your results by keyword, location, language, and date. Begin at the Library's homepage at www.nenpl.org. Choose "Online Research" and click on "Encore." Type in some keywords to search and click on "Find It!" Encore searches through all of the libraries in Suffolk County. Facets and tags help refine your search. For example, a simple search in Encore for "giraffe" results in 105 items in the Northport-East Northport Library Collection, 307 books county-wide, and 4 Spanish-language books. If an item of interest is not in the Northport-East Northport Library collection, click on "Request It" and the item will be requested from another library. Take a look at "Popular Choices" highlighted to the right of the screen. Suggested search tags help broaden or narrow your search. Explore entries in magazines, newspapers, and reference books using the links which launch a "Research Pro" search through the Library's subscription databases. Encore gets a standing ovation when it comes to finding more at your Library and beyond. Please try it and let us know what you think!



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


