Abrams, who led the band until his death in 1992, played with Dizzy Gillespie on the first bebop recordings ever cut. This is but one

reason why the band is considered a true icon among New York City big swing bands. Now under the direction of saxophonist Don Conway and conductor Cyril Green, the band keeps Abrams' style alive with help from a core of Abrams' original instrumentalists. The band's vocalist, Donna Cumberbatch, is the daughter of jazz baritone saxophonist Harold Cumberbatch. She has also performed with The Brooklyn Philharmonic Orchestra, the Harlem Renaissance Orchestra, Dierdre Murray, Lonnie Plaxico, Steve Wilson, and Andy Bey to name a few. The 17 members of the Ray Abrams Big Swing Band consistently recreate the hard swinging, finger-snapping, toe-tapping sounds of the greatest swing bands of the 40s and 50s.


