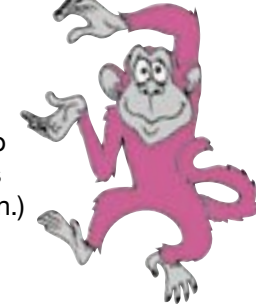

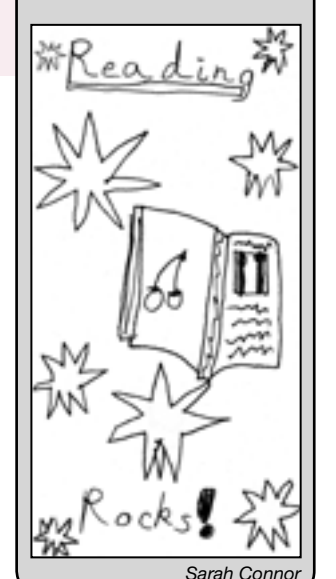

Going Greener

"The environment is . . . the one thing that all of us share. It is not only a mirror of ourselves but a focusing lens on what we can become."
— Lady Bird Johnson

"Green" is the term used to indicate an environmentally-friendly approach to the use of resources. "Going greener" means adopting healthy policies that will ensure that resources are used wisely, economically, and efficiently.

Because of the resource sharing nature of the Library, it can be said that libraries are inherently green. Each book, magazine, DVD, audiobook, or computer, is used over and over again by many.

The Northport-East Northport Public Library has adopted the following "green" practices and is exploring cost effective ways to implement more every day:

- Cardboard, newspapers, electronics, and batteries are recycled through the Town of Huntington
- Printer and toner cartridges are recycled
- Paper used for in-house printing is 30% recycled content
- Grass and lawn clippings are mechanically mulched and retained as fertilizer
- Yard waste, leaves, and tree limbs are ground and chipped for ground cover. Only recycled, recaptured mulch is used in the Library's planting beds
- Organic lawn care products are used whenever possible
- Biodegradable paper plates and cups are used in the Library Cafe
- Cans and bottles from the Library Cafe are recycled
- 98% of the lighting in the library buildings is provided by energy-saving fluorescent bulbs
- Lighting in restrooms is sensor-activated
- 25% of the Library's cleaning supplies are Green Seal certified, and the goal is to increase that amount
- Retired appliances and metal waste are sent to the Town of Smithtown recycling and recovery plant
- Shipping and packaging materials are removed and stored for use in future mailings
- HVAC freon gas is captured, cleaned and replaced during repairs of the ventilation systems

Some of the green initiatives we foresee in the near future:

- Installation of sensor-activated faucets and paper towel dispensers in restrooms
- Use of more recycled office supplies
- Replacement of CRT computer monitors with more energy-efficient LCD screens

The Library will continue to look for ways to "go greener." We encourage the community to join us!

The Precisions

(N) Wednesday, July 11, 7:00 p.m.

Sail back in time with the doo-wop sounds of The Precisions. Originally from the street corners of Brooklyn, The Precisions hit the national record charts with their 1962 arrangement of George and Ira Gershwin's "Someone to Watch Over Me." The group soon followed with the release of "Cleopatra."

While under contract in the 1960s with Golden Crest Records, The Precisions performed with top artists of the era including Alan Freed, Murray the K, and the WABC "All Americans" in appearances at the Brooklyn Fox, the New York Paramount, and the legendary Apollo Theater.

The group re-formed in 1996 with members Phil Ferrito and Bob Falco (vocals), Al Frazia (bass & vocals), Robbie Falco (drums), and Frankie Carr, nationally renowned guitarist and former star of the Broadway hit "Beatlemania."

The pinpoint harmony of their four lead vocalists are key to their distinctive style. Along with their original recordings, The Precisions pay tribute to the sounds of Motown with songs by The Temptations, Smokey Robinson & The Miracles, and The Four Tops.

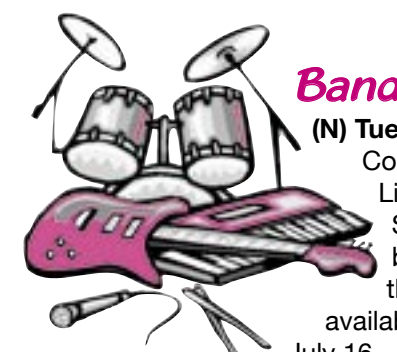

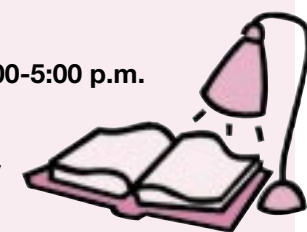
