Firmly rooted in the traditional forms of American song, Dylan's music became the poetic voice of the protest movement.

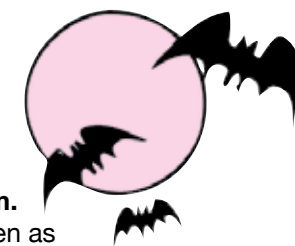
Health Insurance Information, Counseling & Assistance Program

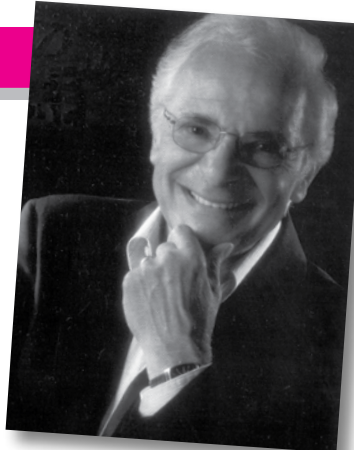


Book-A-Trip to Rockefeller Center, Delegates Dining Room & Metropolitan Museum of Art Tuesday, December 5, 2006
