which can once again enliven and improve the East Northport streetscape. It will enhance the grounds surrounding the library, including the adjoining John Walsh playground and park complex. This public work of art will forever instill pride in the community, as well as in the Library. All who travel Larkfield Road, the community's "Main Street," will have the opportunity to view a unique folk-art sculpture

The projected cost for casting and installing a permanent metal sculpture is approximately \$60,000. The Library has already received a grant in the amount of \$10,000 from Senator Carl Marcellino. This fall our goal is to raise the funds to Bring Back the Bear and to dedicate the sculpture in the fall of 2007. We are relying on the generosity of our community to help us reach this goal.






