



Who's On Board?

A Northport resident for 29 years, new Library Trustee **William Martin** has worn many hats. After receiving a B.A. Degree in English from Hofstra, he served as a U.S. Army officer in Germany. When he returned to the states, he started a 35-year career in the Northport-East Northport School District where he was a high school English teacher, a football and baseball coach, a junior high school English chairperson, and finally a high school associate principal until he retired in 1996.

During his school career, Bill Martin was very involved



with community groups, especially The Place and YDA. Along with his teaching duties, supervisory duties, and extracurricular activities, he managed to find time to earn a Masters Degree in Secondary Education and a Certificate of Advance Study in School Administration and Supervision.

Mr. Martin currently works part-time at Nassau Community College as a Writing Tutor in the college's writing center. He also wrote 12 chapters in the recently published book, *Lifescripts for Managers*. In his spare time the only thing he likes better than reading, building a model airplane, or dabbling in some writing, is playing with granddaughter Aine.

Bill Martin and his wife Barbara raised their four children, Deirdre, Bill, Allison, and Beth in Northport, and because their house is very close to the Library, they've spent a great deal of time here.
