

Resident Ely Roll's comments sum up the feelings of many in the community when she wrote "You have enriched all of us with the beauty of your mural and added another dimension to East Northport becoming a cohesive community in its own right."





Tile plaques on both sides of the Library fireplace show the names of those individuals, families, and groups who contributed to the project.

The Library's Millennium Bookball Sculpture in Northport provides community members with another opportunity to support an artistic project while commemorating the new millennium.
