

Swing with The Sophisticated Ladies



When you find the item you want on the OPAC screen choose "G" and then follow the prompts to enter your name, barcode number and pin number. A library staff member will process your request and you will be notified when your material is ready to be picked up. Please limit your requests to three items per day. 
