

Here's the M.O. ...



Summer reading clubs are not only fun, they are essential. An early introduction to books and involvement in reading programs does make a difference in a child's life. Recent research indicates that elementary-aged children can lose as much as four months progress in reading skills during summer vacations if they don't read regularly. A reading program based on a fun theme is a great way to encourage and support your children's reading interests and curiosity so reading remains an enjoyable challenge. VISIT THE PUBLIC LIBRARY OFTEN. Help your child discover the adventure and fun of choosing books from the library's collections. Be sure that each child has his/her own library card. At the Northport-East Northport Public Library, children are eligible for library cards from the day they are born . . . they are born readers!



This year's reading club theme is Solve It At The Library. Young adults will enjoy a writing workshop, crafts, a "Solve It IN The Library" mystery, an Internet Scavenger Hunt and more. The YAs are being encouraged to read by earning opportunities to receive free YA paperbacks. Invitations to "WHODUNIT," the end-of-summer YA party, are earned by fulfilling the reading requirement for the summer program. The YA CORNER is a welcoming space for your child this summer.



Any child can join the reading clubs. Children as young as two years old have participated. Books are read to preschoolers in the **Solve It Sidekicks Read-To-Me Club** by parents, grandparents, siblings, and babysitters. Children in grades 1-3 are encouraged to join the **Super Sleuths Elementary Readers**. Older children, in grades 4 and up, are part of the **Young Sherlocks Contract Readers** program.

Young adults who participate in the Solve It At The Library reading club have an added benefit. They will become familiar with the friendly staff and resources available to them throughout the library — and this will be helpful in September when homework assignments are once again underway.



An unlimited opportunity to explore, learn, create, investigate, socialize, and read is found in the library. Each child who enrolls in this summer's reading club in the Children's Room will receive a "detective kit" which will contain a detective pencil and time chart along with some fun surprises. Children will keep track of the amount of time they read and will report in to the Chief Investigators (library staff) periodically. Our children's librarians will be on hand everyday to help children detect new books and expand their reading horizons. PICTURE BOOK ART




