





NETWALK Users: INTERNET STATION NOW AVAILABLE IN THE LIBRARY

A computer terminal, dedicated for Internet use, is now available at the Northport Library for patrons interested in exploring cyberspace. A patron who wishes to use the Internet Station must have a Northport-East Northport library card and be a NETWALK account holder. NETWALK is the Northport-East Northport Public Library's gateway to the Internet through SuffolkNet, a cooperative project developed by the libraries in Suffolk County to provide access to the information superhighway in a cost effective manner. The Reference Department has prepared Quick Start Guides to help you navigate the Internet. NETWALK, the Northport-East Northport Threshold to World and Local Knowledge, is a research tool that complements your library's rich and varied resources. Stop by the reference desk for more information.



An early introduction to books and involvement in reading programs does make a difference in a child's life. Summer reading clubs are not only fun, they are essential. Recent research indicates that elementary-aged children can lose as much as four months progress in reading skills during summer vacations if they don't read regularly. A reading program based on a fun theme is a great way to encourage and support your children's reading interests and curiosity so reading remains an enjoyable challenge. VISIT THE PUBLIC LIBRARY OFTEN. Help your child discover the adventure and fun of choosing books from the library's collections. Be sure that each child has his/her own library card. In the Northport-East Northport library district, children are eligible for library cards from the day they are born . . . they are born readers!

Professional librarians design summer reading programs to encourage children to enjoy books and reading. Each year, the Children's and Young Adult librarians welcome summer with reading clubs that revolve around themes. This year's Olympic theme is **Read to Win**. Librarians are always available to help children and young adults select books. The "Best Books of the Year" bibliogra-

phies are prepared by librarians suggesting notable authors and titles for different reading levels. Audio books and paperbacks are also popular with children and young adults participating in the summer reading clubs.

Your librarians are always ready to recommend their favorites.



The Players

(Your All-Star KIDS)

Any child can join the reading clubs. Children as young as two years old have participated. Books are read to preschoolers in the "Read to Me Club" by parents, grandparents, siblings, and babysitters. Children in grades K-3 are

encouraged to read on their own. Older children, grades 4 and up, contract with the library for the number of books they hope to read on their own. Children who are entering sixth grade can continue to participate as "contract kids," join the Young Adult Summer Reading Program, or do both.

Youngsters about to enter the sixth grade are encouraged to "move up" to the Young Adult Summer Reading Program for middle schoolers. This is their time to discover the riches available in the Young Adult Corner — it's a time when the Homework Center becomes the **READ TO WIN** Center. New middle schoolers who participate in the Young Adult Summer Reading Program have an added benefit. By exploring the "upstairs" of the library as part of summer leisure time, these young adults become familiar with the friendly staff and resources available to help them in September when homework assignments are underway.

The Game

An unlimited opportunity to explore, learn, create, investigate, socialize, and read is found in the library. As youngsters **Read** to **Win**, they earn incentives for each book they complete and share with the Summer Reading Club Staff. One of the goals of the summer reading clubs is to help children experience a feeling of accomplishment . . . so August becomes the month for celebration. Children who complete their reading commitments attend closing parties featuring special performances and refreshments; and the young adult pizza party is always a hot ticket.

Ready, Set, Read!

A record number of youngsters participated in the 1995 summer reading program. We challenge the community's young readers to set new records for 1996. The winning team is already in place — You, your kids, and the library.

Summer Overtime

Take time out from reading and spend some time with a mouse. The library has hundreds of computer programs to enjoy. Favorites for children include *Arthur's Teacher Trouble*, *The Magic School Bus*, *The Animals! Facemaker*, and *Math Blaster Plus* and for young adults include *Where in Space is Carmen Sandiego*, *Special Days*, and *Ticket to Paris*.

The Art Roster

Learn the art of Navajo sand painting, design a mosaic box, try your hand at paper batiking, create a self-portrait, make a paperweight.
