





LIBRARY DIRECTOR RECEIVES ROTARY'S HIGHEST HONOR



Stephanie Heineman, Director of the Northport-East Northport Public Library, was recently named a Paul Harris Fellow, Rotary's highest honor, by the Northport Rotary Club. Mrs. Heineman, who has served as library director since 1988 and as a Rotary member since 1990, was honored for her "tangible and significant commitment to the furtherance of better understanding and friendly relations among peoples of the world."

One of the first women to join the Northport Rotary, Mrs. Heineman has served on the club's Board of Directors for four years, as secretary for two years, and in 1994 received the Rotarian of the Year award.

"I am thrilled and honored to receive this award," says Mrs. Heineman. "My involvement in the Rotary is an extension of the work we do at the library. As vital forces in the community, both the Rotary and the library seek to better the lives of community residents through education and service."

A primary focus of Mrs. Heineman's administration has been to find a solution to the space problems of the two existing library buildings. Following years of dedicated work and attention to the needs of the community, that goal will finally be reached. In September of 1995 the community overwhelmingly passed a \$7.5

million dollar referendum to build a new, 20,000-square-foot East Northport Library building which will be completed in the spring of 1997, and the expansion and complete renovation of a 36,000-square-foot Northport Library building which will be completed in the fall of 1997.

During her nine years as library director, Mrs. Heineman has sought dynamic and innovative ways of serving the Northport-East Northport community. The library's award-winning newsletter actively markets library service to every resident and serves as a vital communication link to the community. Over the past nine years, the library's community service projects have been recognized with awards from the Library Public Relations Council, the Long Island Archives Council, the Long Island Railroad, and the American Legion. The library's program called Special Loan Service For Our Schools has strengthened school and library relations and given concrete support to the work of district teachers. "We pride ourselves on discovering new ways to reach every segment of the community while emphasizing personalized, one-on-one relationships with everyone who uses the library," says Mrs. Heineman.

Under Mrs. Heineman's leadership, the Northport-East Northport Public Library has also taken great strides in making information and technology more accessible to community residents. Mrs. Heineman is a member of the Long Range Planning Committee of the Suffolk Cooperative Library System which was instrumental in bringing free Internet access to all county residents. The Northport-East Northport Public Library is also among the handful of Suffolk County libraries that maintains an on-site Internet terminal. In 1997, as part of a new automation consortium of 27 public libraries, the Northport-East Northport Public Library will unveil an on-line public access catalog linking it to all the public libraries in Suffolk County.

"Since beginning my library career almost thirty years ago, I have witnessed a remarkable growth in all avenues of library service and information technology. Suffolk County's public libraries are on the cutting edge of this trend and the Northport-East Northport Public Library is among the leaders in this effort."

Mrs. Heineman values her service to the Northport-East Northport community through the Rotary and looks forward to continuing the library's close connection to the community.


