# We're Wrapping Up the Card Catalog

Before the Northport building expansion and renovation is complete, we'll be seeking new homes for the card catalog. In early 1997, an online public access catalog (OPAC) will be introduced in the Northport library and in the temporary site in East Northport. The transition from drawers filled with cards to keyboards connected to terminals will be gradual. In Northport, we will not retire the card catalog until patrons have become familiar with the new OPACs. In East Northport, the card catalog cabinets found new homes last summer when many items were auctioned to the community and we prepared for the library's move to the temporary site. So now, we'd like to ask the question:

# What can you do with an old card catalog?

Here are some answers from patrons who have taken the East Northport card catalog out of retirement:

- Make a coffee table out of it and display those heavy coffee table books.
- Use it to store your computer's 3.5" floppy disks.
- Put it to work in your woodworking area and organize your nails, screws, and bolts by size.
- Create an old-fashioned card catalog for your home library.


