**Hans Gabali, Long Island Muralist**

German-born Hans Gabali (1920-2006) was a Northport resident who painted more than 4,500 murals in private homes and on business walls all over Long Island. His work transformed blank spaces into oceans, fishing shanties, deserts, and Alpine villages. Some murals have been painted over or hidden; others are threatened by the weather or changes in building ownership. Fortunately, Martha Kreisel, a retired librarian and associate professor at Hofstra University, has created an electronic archive to preserve Gabali's murals. She will share her slide show of the murals and talk about where Gabali's work fits into the mural community as a whole. No registration required.


