Mr. Olney, a life-long resident of East Northport, began his library career as a library assistant at the Northport Junior High School. He joined the Northport-East Northport Public Library staff 27 years ago as a Library Page. After earning a Master of Science in Library and Information Science, he continued his education and received a Master of Business Administration as well as an Advanced Certificate in Public Library Administration. Mr. Olney was promoted from Computer Services Department Head to Assistant Director of the Library in 2003. He has served in that capacity until now. In addition to anticipating the future needs of information technology and leading the implementation and integration

of computers throughout the library, Mr. Olney administered personnel and human resources, coordinated professional development and training, oversaw the collection budget and expenditures, and assisted the Director with the daily operations of a Library that serves a community of more than 36,000 residents. "I have always had a love of learning and feel honored that I will have this opportunity to serve my community. I look forward to working with newly appointed Assistant Director Nancy Morcerf. We will continue the standard of outstanding Library service that retiring Director Eileen Minogue has established with her devotion and responsiveness," said Mr. Olney. "We will strive to ensure that the Library remains a vital resource to the community and that the needs of our residents are recognized and addressed in a considerate and thoughtful manner."

Books


