The Library is pleased to present an evening with Lee Woodruff, author of the new novel *This We Love Most*. This is Lee Woodruff's first novel, following her essay collection, *Perfectly Imperfect*, and the bestseller *In an Instant*. Co-written with her husband, ABC news anchor Bob Woodruff, *In an Instant* chronicles their family's life in the aftermath of a traumatic brain injury Bob suffered while embedded with the U.S. military in Iraq. Her newest novel explores similar themes: A sudden tragedy strikes one person, leading many others along a complex emotional path that winds in and around an entire family.

A contributing editor to *CBS This Morning*, Lee Woodruff and her husband founded the Bob Woodruff Foundation to assist wounded service members and their families. 



- ★ **Check Out Library Materials about Veterans Day**
Learn about the history and significance of Veterans Day, as well as specific military people and events in history, with materials from our collection. Reference Librarians have compiled several bibliographies in honor of veterans, including *Library Resources for Veterans & Their Families*, *Military Heroes*, and *Honoring Veterans: Films and TV Series*.
- ★ **Visit the Veterans Day Display**
Materials for veterans and their families about benefits, health, education, and employment will be on display in both library buildings during the month of November. In addition, a section of the community bulletin board is dedicated to relevant veteran information throughout the year.
- ★ **Explore the Veterans Topic Guide**
The Live-brary.com Topic Guide for Veterans is an online guide that includes information and resources about benefits, education, employment, health, military families, volunteer opportunities, and Veterans Day. Visit suffolktopicguides.org/veteransaffairs to search the Veterans Topic Guide for books, articles, links to relevant organizations, useful phone numbers, local events, videos, RSS feeds, and more.
- ★ **Check Out the Backpack Storytime for Military Families**
The Children's Department has compiled themed materials for military families including books, pamphlets, music, and puzzles.
- ★ **Become a Volunteer**
Teens can participate in the Library's Teen Advisory Board Holiday Greetings for the Troops program on Tuesday, November 13. Others can write letters to soldiers through organizations such as Operation Gratitude and volunteer at a veterans facility such as the Northport VA Medical Center.
