Library Programs & Resources for Veterans & Their Families

The Northport-East Northport Public Library is proud to support our community's veterans and their families. The Library has partnered with the Northport VA Medical Center, developed a new online Topic Guide for Veterans (see back page), and dedicated a section of our community bulletin board to relevant veteran information. Our active Teen Services Department is also involved by organizing new teen volunteer opportunities to honor veterans.

The Library is committed to continuing its outreach to our country's military men and women. Our Reference Librarians are available in person, by phone, or by email to answer your questions or to help you use any of the Library's resources.

Veterans Health Care Benefits

(N) Thursday, November 18, 7:30 p.m.
Joe Sledge, Public Affairs Officer at the Northport Veterans Administration Medical Center, will describe health care benefits and other services available to Long Island veterans at the Northport VA Medical Center. He will also share information about the history of the VA and how the VA is taking a lead in the areas of quality, safety, and technology in health care. 


