### History in the Local Headlines

A FRIGHTFUL DISASTER — STEAMSHIP TITANIC STRUCK ICEBERG — 1598 PERSONS PERISHED.  
The monster new steamship *Titanic* of the *White Star* line struck an iceberg off the New Foundland coast Sunday night and four hours later sank in water two miles deep.

— *Port Jefferson Echo*, April 20, 1912  
(Following this article is one about a Smithtown man who was a passenger.)

Did you know that you can search articles from eight **Suffolk Historic Newspapers** through the Library's website? This invaluable collection includes familiar publications such as *The Long Islander*, as well as less familiar newspapers such as *The Long Island Traveler*, *The Sag Harbor Express*, and *The South Side Signal*.

For example, a search on Abraham Lincoln provides this perspective on his personal style: "Mr. Lincoln stands six feet four inches high in his stockings. His frame is not muscular, but gaunt and wiry; his arms are long, but not unreasonably so for a person of his height. In walking, his gait though firm is never brisk. He steps slowly and deliberately, almost always with his head inclined forward and his hands clasped behind his back." (from *The Long Islander*, January 18, 1861)

To search one of Suffolk County's historical newspapers, go to the Library's website at [www.nenpl.org](http://www.nenpl.org). Click on "Online Research" at the top of the screen. Choose "Newspapers" from the menu on the left. Click on the link for "Suffolk Historic Newspapers." Click on "Search Newspapers" at the top of the screen and type in your search terms. You can also go beyond the headlines and into the papers for articles and advertisements which capture moments in history.

Finding a great book is all about making the right connections. Now you have extra help with **NextReads**, a free online newsletter available through the Library's website. **NextReads** provides email newsletters in more than 20 fiction and nonfiction categories. Fiction, Biography and Memoir, Historical Fiction, Science Fiction, Business and Personal Finance, Nature and Science, Popular Culture, Kids Books, and Tween Reads are just some of the categories you may subscribe to. Each newsletter includes recently released titles and may include additional recommendations of older books, or lists of books grouped by a theme.

You can subscribe to as many newsletters as you'd like. Just go to the Library's website at [www.nenpl.org](http://www.nenpl.org), click on "Online Research," then "Databases Alphabetically," and scroll down to the **NextReads** link. Each newsletter links to the Library's online catalog so that you may immediately request the books that interest you. Here are some samples of recent NextReads suggestions:

Intrigued by Chicago? Let V.I. Warshawski show you around. In *Hardball*, the fourteenth book to feature V.I., she is hired to track down a man who disappeared 40 years ago. While working the case, V.I. unearths skeletons in the city's closet . . . and possibly in her own family's.

**From the Romance newsletter:**

**Temp Me at Twilight** by Lisa Kleypas  
When unconventional Poppy Hathaway's reputation is endangered by her sister's pet ferret (a must-read first chapter if ever there was one!), Poppy has no choice but to marry Harry Rutledge, an enigmatic hotel owner with a dangerous hidden life. Set in Victorian London, this witty story is the third book in the Hathaway series.


**From the Biography and Memoir newsletter:**

He ended up homeless, living in Central Park. Through determination and hard work he eventually learned English and made his way to medical school. Now a physician and an American citizen, Deo continually returns to Burundi, where he has set up a medical clinic.

This long-awaited chronicle of NFL player and army ranger Pat Tillman's life and controversial death in Afghanistan draws on his journals and letters as well as interviews with family members and fellow soldiers.

**For Adults**

*A Breath of Snow and Ashes* by Diana Gabaldon  
On the eve of the American Revolution, Jamie Fraser is asked to help protect the colonies for King and Crown, but, thanks to his time-traveling twentieth-century wife, Jamie is aware of how the rebellion ends.

*The Body in the Snowdrift* by Katherine Hall Page  
Traveling to Vermont, caterer Faith Fairchild stumbles upon the dead body of a local lawyer and wonders if his death was accidental or intentional.

*Crimson Snow* by Jeanne M. Dams  
In this story based on a real 1904 murder case, subtle observations on life at the turn of the twentieth century are combined with a plot that unravels the secrets behind the murder of a schoolteacher.

*Dashing through the Snow* by Mary Higgins Clark  
Private investigator Regan Reilly and amateur sleuth Alvirah Meehan investigate shenanigans involving the local mega lottery.

*Last Snow* by Eric Van Lustbader  
Jack McClure sets out from Moscow across Eastern Europe, following a perilous trail of diplomats, criminals, and corrupt politicians to find out how and why an American senator turns up dead.

*Light on Snow* by Anita Shreve  
When a father and his daughter find an abandoned infant in the snow, the event forever alters the young girl's understanding of the world.

*On a Snowy Night* by Debbie Macomber  
Two holiday novels feature a woman who is kidnapped while journeying to Alaska to marry a man she met on the Internet, and two lovers reunited after more than a decade.

**For Children**

*Snow* by Orhan Pamuk  
After years of lonely political exile, Turkish poet Ka returns to Istanbul to attend his mother's funeral and learns about a series of suicides among pious girls forbidden to wear head scarves.

*Snow Angels* by Stewart O'Nan  
A grown man recounts two interwoven events which occurred when he was a boy, the break up of his family, and the murder of his babysitter.

*Snowfall at Willow Lake* by Susan Wiggs  
After surviving a hostage situation, lawyer Sophie Bellamy returns home to the peaceful Catskills village of Avalon where she falls in love with the local veterinarian.

*Tide, Feather, Snow: A Life in Alaska* by Miranda Weiss  
The author and her boyfriend relocated from an east-coast suburb to the extreme climates of Alaska's country and had to learn about weather, water, and the fishing season.
