#### Scanning And Reading Appliance

SARA is the newest addition to our library family. SARA stands for Scanning And Reading Appliance. SARA can be used to read printed materials, or to listen to Talking Books\* or books on CD. Originally designed for those with low vision or vision disability SARA can also be of use to those studying ESL or individuals with learning disabilities. The appliance works by scanning a printed page, displaying large print text on a computer screen, and reading that text aloud to the user.

In addition to reading documents provided by the user, SARA also has a library of classic literary works already loaded and ready to be listened to.

We would be happy to assist you in getting to know SARA, which is currently located in the Northport Library.
