A stint in the Air Force postponed his education plans, but he eventually received his master's degree from Brooklyn College. Realizing that making a living as an artist would be very difficult, Taub earned an advanced degree in administration from New York University. In 1962 he began a long and distinguished career as an educator and administrator at Northport High School. Following retirement, Taub was finally able to devote time to his first love—art. He credits much of his artistic vision to two fine teachers he worked with at Brooklyn College—abstract painters Ad Reinhardt and Harry Holtzman. He also credits a more recent influence. Constance Wain Schwartz. who urged him to follow his vision.


