

Founded by the Children's Book Council, Children's Book Week introduces young people to new authors and ideas in libraries, schools, homes, and bookstores. In celebration of this annual event, the Children's Librarians of the Northport-East

Northport Public Library would like to share this list of some of their recent favorite books for children.

Granny Torrelli Makes Soup by Sharon Creech Using food and stories from her childhood, Rosie's grandmother teaches her about life and friendship.

Joey Pigza Swallowed the Key by Jack Gantos Being energetic and having difficulty staying on task plunges Joey into many wild situations at home and at school.

Joseph Had a Little Overcoat by Simms Taback You can always make something out of nothing, or so the saying goes. Simms Taback tells a wonderful tale in this colorfully-illustrated and poignant book about a poor man and his ragged coat.

The King of Mulberry Street by Donna Jo Napoli New York City street life in 1892 comes to life as Dom, a 19-year-old stowaway from Naples, learns to survive in the streets of lower Manhattan.

Kira-Kira by Cynthia Kadohata

Set in the 1950s, this book tells of the struggles, joys, and heartbreak of a Japanese-American family that moves to a predominately white town in rural Georgia.

The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane by Kate DiCamillo Life turns on a dime when a fine porcelain rabbit, who hates being described as a doll, falls headlong into an adventure story full of extraordinary wonder.

The Penderwicks: A Summer Tale of Four Sisters. Two Rabbits, and a Very Interesting Boy by Jeanne Birdsall Four very different but spunky sisters spend their summer vacation in a cottage on an estate, getting into adventures and near-disasters as they befriend the owner's son.

Saffy's Angel by Hilary McKay

Unforgettable characters come alive in this humorous and absorbing story about the artistic Casson family and the search for Saffy's stone angel.

The Spider and the Fly by Mary Howitt Hauntingly beautiful, this is the melancholy cautionary tale of Ms. Fly who learns soon enough that not everyone who talks sweetly offers sweets.

The Thief Lord by Cornelia Funke This novel is an adventure with a dash of mystery and magic about two runaway boys in Venice.

The Three Pigs by David Wiesner

In this fun and unique version of the traditional tale, the three pigs make a surprising escape from the Big Bad Wolf and meet up with characters from familiar fairy tales.




