A Message from the Library Board of Trustees

Unrivaled Service, Unparalleled Value

In January 2006 the Times Beacon Record proclaimed the Northport-East Northport Public Library as The Good Neighbor in the Community for 2005. The Library was cited for its "Courteous, friendly, and orofessional services; creative ways of acknowledging and involving the community . . . and savvy in augmenting public resources without overburdening the taxpayers." In planning for its fiscal 2006/2007 budget, the Library's goal is to continue to foster these qualities.

The Library Board envisions the Library in the community as an educational arena for patrons from birth through a lifetime of learning, as an access point for state-of-the-art technology, and as a magnet for community gatherings and activities. The Library Administration accomplishes this through continuous careful planning. We place the highest expectation on staff performance and adhere to a strict balance of excellent library service and the prudent use of tax dollars.

Libraries no longer consider their measure of

success solely through door counts and circulation statistics. Libraries are using business strategies to produce measurable evidence that programs and services vield a successful outcome. The Economic Value of Public Libraries in Suffolk County, New York, a research report commissioned by the Suffolk Cooperative Library System, was completed in June by Dr. Pearl Kamer, Chief Economist for the Long Island Association.* Using Dr. Kamer's formula with our Library's statistics has indicated a \$3.50 return on each tax dollar invested in the Northport-East Northport Public Library. The Rauch Foundation recently released a study published in Newsday (December 1, 2005). The study surveyed 1,215 Long Islanders to evaluate how they would rate local services. Libraries received the highest ranking with 82% of

residents rating library service as good or excellent.

Always mindful of the state of the Long Island economy, and being sensitive to our taxpaying residents, we are proposing a Fiscal 2006/2007 Budget that presents a modest 3.55% increase in expenditures with a 3.84% increase to be raised by taxation. We are also cognizant of how, during uncertain economic times, libraries become more essential, more important, and more utilized by patrons.

Our new Library Courtyard has added 3,000 square feet of outdoor public space, providing another benefit for patrons of all ages and giving us the opportunity to offer more service. The courtyard was funded entirely through generous gifts and private donations. Library patron Bob Smith commented on the courtyard, "In modern-day America, the role of the library has expanded to be more than a collection of books. It's a meeting place and a place for the exchange of ideas and thoughts. I find this area to be very relaxing. The Courtyard will be very well-received by the community. I look forward to a long, intellectually profitable use of this area."

Whether one looks at hard data provided through the study by L.I.A. Chief Economist Kamer, the findings of the Rauch survey of Long Island residents, the testimony of our own Northport-East Northport patrons, or the Times Beacon Record Good Neighbor Award, the Northport-East Northport Public Library continues to return more to the community than it costs — through unrivaled service and unparalleled value.


