- registered to vote.

If you have not voted within four years in a general, school, or library election, re-registration is required. Registration may be made in person prior to March 30 at the following location: the offices of the School District Clerk, 158 Laurel Avenue, Northport; Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. any day that school is in session.

You may register prior to March 25 at the Suffolk County Board of Elections, Yaphank Ave., Yaphank; Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

You may register by mail using application forms available in both library buildings. Applications must be received at the Suffolk County Board of Elections no later than March 25, 2005.

**Absentee Applications** — Applications for absentee ballots are available in both library buildings.
