**"Monsters, Magic & Mayhem" Fantasy & Adventure Illustration by Jeff A. Menges**  
The work of Northport resident Jeff A. Menges has appeared in print for 20 years. His illustrations feature imaginative and adventurous themes from books, games, and the recesses of his own mind.

A 1987 Graduate of Parsons School of Design, Mr. Menges' career has meandered through art direction, design work, and editing—but illustration remains a constant. His clients have included such companies as TSR (*Dungeons and Dragons*) and Wizards of the Coast (*Magic; The Gathering*), and many other companies in the game industry. Having done work on role-playing games, collectible card games, and traditional board games, Mr. Menges created his first book cover for Dover Publications, where he currently works as a cover designer. In that position he has illustrated covers for R. L. Stevenson, Poe, Burroughs, and others. Many of these will be displayed in this show.

Mr. Menges has also had work published in the form of stickers, temporary tattoos, and in coloring books. He is very active with Dover in republishing works of Golden Age illustrators and Victorian painters. The month of August will mark the beginning of his next pursuit—an MA in Illustration from the Fashion Institute of Technology.
