


Reading, Writing, and the ELA

Update from the Board of Trustees

Fiber Optics Installed

Fiber-optic lines are strands of optically pure glass that can carry digital information at high speeds. Dedicated fiber optic lines have now been installed to connect the Northport and East Northport library buildings. These lines will provide high-speed data transfer and voice communication between our buildings and will replace multiple subscriber lines. We are looking forward to this investment reducing our future telecommunication costs, supplying a significant increase in data transfer capacity, and providing the infrastructure for future development.
