





Saluting Local Women of Courage & Vision

Edna "Sis" Olmsted (1908-1999)world traveler

Sis Olmsted of Northport was one of the first two women to travel around the world alone by truck. Meeting the qualifications for a companion who could drive, shoot, and not talk too much, in 1933 Miss Olmsted, an expert mechanic, drove with Leila Roosevelt on primitive, often dangerous roads from Belgium to Singapore. In Singapore, where Miss Roosevelt's husband was working as a cinematographer, the two decided to turn their journey into a round-the-world adventure, continuing on across Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii, and the United States.



March is Women's History Month
