Best known today for his Winnie-the-Pooh books, A.A. Milne (1882-1956) began his career writing humorous essays for the British magazine *Punch*. After a stint in the British army during World War I, Milne turned to playwriting as well. Milne wrote When We Were Very Young, a book of verse for children, in 1924 as a break between writing plays. The book was well received and a *New York* Herald Tribune book review called it "the very music of childhood." Pooh was inspired by a teddy bear belonging to Milne's son, Christopher. Milne implied that some poems were based on his son's activities, but others were drawn from memories of his own childhood. Milne then wrote two books of short stories, Winnie-the-Pooh (1926) and The House at Pooh Corner (1928) as well as another book of verse, Now We Are Six (1927). Ernest H. Shepard whimsically illustrated all four books.

Perennial favorites of children and adults throughout the world, the Pooh books have been translated into more than twenty-five languages.
