
The Northport Rotary Memorial Jazz Concert presents

Ron Odrich, the clarinet- and alto sax-playing leader of the group, is a widely-respected dental surgeon. He has also been called a "world-class musician" by such jazz luminaries as Buddy DeFranco and Clark Terry. Ron has taught Masters Classes in jazz clarinet at Northwestern University and has played with Clark Terry and Buddy DeFranco and recorded with Phil Woods and Zoot Sims.

Don Friedman, the quartet's gifted pianist, has been acclaimed by his many admiring critics as "one of the most creative pianists in jazz today." He has played and recorded with many jazz greats includ-

ing Clark Terry, Chet Baker, Phil Woods, Bobby Hacket, and "The Tonight Show" band

By every critic's assessment, the quartet's bassist, Steven LaSpina, is superb. He has played and recorded with many jazz greats including Marian McPartland, Stan Getz, and Clark Terry.

Bob Litwak, on drums, is Professor of Cardiothoracic Surgery at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine. Prior to his medical career, he studied with Glenn Miller's drummer "Mo" Purtill and played as a full-time musician with several big bands in and around New York City.

The audience will have the opportunity to meet the performers and enjoy refreshments during the concert intermission.



The WONDERFUL WIZARD %DZ

One of the true classics of American literature, The Wonderful Wizard of Oz has stirred the imaginations of young and old alike for over four generations. Its author, L. Frank Baum, was born in Chittenango, New York in 1856. Baum tried his hand at numerous professions, but discovered at age forty that his true talent lay in the writing of fantasy. Many publishers refused to print *The Wizard* saying it was too radical a departure from the literature of the day. In 1900 Baum and illustrator W.W. Denslow paid to have it published by a small Chicago press. It was an immediate bestseller and, along with the thirteen-book Oz series which followed, was read with the same fervor that children today read the Harry Potter series. In 1999 *The Wizard* was chosen by the Northport-East Northport community as one of the Best Books of the Century and is included on The Millennium Book-

Adults reading *The Wizard* discover allusions to turn-of-the-century American politics during a time

of populists, progressives, and Utopian schemes. American ideals are embodied in Oz so that good

intentions, ingenuity, and self-confidence always win the day. Using familiar elements such as cornfields, things made of tin, and circus animals, and the stuff of fairy tales — witches, wizards, and magic — Baum creates a beguiling fantasy that encourages children to look for wonder in the ordinary things around them.

Children have loved The Wonderful Wizard of Oz for the last 100 years. The tale of Dorothy and her friends is a captivating story filled with delightful characters, magic, and exciting adventures.

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
