

The Northport Piano Trio, featuring Katherine LoMonaco, violin; Walter Schneider, piano; and Gary Beck, cello, presents its "Tenth Anniversary Concert." The Trio has performed extensively on Long Island in events such as the Huntington Arts Council's Summer Arts Festival, the Islip Arts Council's Summer Concert Series, and the Oyster Bay Arts Council's Distinguished Artist Series. In 1993 the Trio made its European concert debut in Luxembourg and returned to Europe in 1994 at the invitation of the German-American Association of Kassel, Germany. The ensemble performed in France in 1995, in St. Petersburg, Russia in 1997, and in Helsinki, Finland in 1998. The Trio's first compact disc was also released in 1998. Tickets, which go on sale April 10, are \$1 for adults, 50¢ for students, senior citizens, and persons with disabilities.






