### Swing with The Sophisticated Ladies





### **Place a Request**

Is there a book you'd like to read but can't find on the shelf? Of course you may go to the Reference Desk to ask for a reserve. But now you may also place a request for a reserve on your own by using the Library's Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) or online from your home computer.

The Library is pleased to offer this new service for our patrons: Place A Request. When you find the item you want on the OPAC screen choose "G" and then follow the prompts to enter your name, barcode number and pin number. A library staff member will process your request and you will be notified when your material is ready to be picked up. Please limit your requests to three items per day. If you would like a demonstration of this new feature, please ask a Reference Librarian.



## **Remembering Frederick DeGeorge, Sr.**


### Sunday Family Special: A SHEL-ABRATION

Singer and storyteller Debra Domingoes provides a musical storytime for preschool children and parents.



Your social studies project is due Monday . . . you need to study for a math exam . . . an English paper is due on Thursday! Where do you start?




### Saturday Storytime


